Celebrating Black History Month



To empower Colorado's Black small businesses by providing a comprehensive tool by which to market their products and services to a targeted audience. The Museum is housed in the former home of Dr. Justina L. Ford, first licensed African American female physician in the state of Colorado. While famous for telling the story of the Black cowboys, the museum tells the stories of those early African Americans who came west and performed as miners, soldiers, homesteaders, ranchers, blacksmiths. schoolteachers, lawmen, and every other profession needed to build up and develop the West.



Andrew Beard (1849-1921) was an inventor who transformed railroad transportation. Beard patented a rotary steam engine in 1892 and an automatic train car coupler in 1897.

The African American Registry recognizes Beard's design drawings for "the Automatic Railroad Car Coupler, commonly referred to as the 'Jenny' coupler" – a far safer replacement for the manual coupling used in America's early railroad industry.
